The Elks National Foundation (ENF) has kicked off the 2025 scholarship year. Here are the details!

Most Valuable Student (MVS) Contest:

The 2025 MVS application is now open. Applications can be found online at https://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/ MVS.cfm. The application deadline is November 12, 2024.

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) awards 500 four-year scholarships based on academics, leadership, and financial need. National awards range from \$1,000 per year to \$7,500 per year. The national awards will be announced in April 2025. The top three males and top three females among all of the applicants that apply will advance to the District Level of Judging in December. In addition, the Newport Elks Lodge will be giving out local awards between \$500-\$1,000 per school to the highest scoring students. MVS scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), at a U.S. college or university next school year. Some

important applicant details include:

- Current high school seniors (or equivalent) who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply. ٠
- Applicants do not have to be related to a member of the Elks.
- Male and female students compete separately.

NATIONAL NEWS

National Scholarships student financial assistance programs with ENF **that do not involve the Newport** Elks Scholarship Committee:

<u>Legacy Awards</u> – The Legacy Awards program began on September 1, 2024. Legacy Awards provide \$4,000 scholarships for children and grandchildren of dues-paying Elk members. The ENF offers a total of 350 national awards. The application deadline is February 3, 2025. Please visit <u>https://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/Legacy.cfm</u> for more details and the application link. Winner will be announced in late April 2025

<u>Emergency Educational Grants</u> - Emergency Educational Grants provide undergraduate college financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks in the form of renewable, one-year grants of up to \$5,000. The grant is for educational assistance only and is not intended to cover the entire cost of a college education.

Grant amounts are based on the information submitted in the application and can range up to \$5,000. As long as a student meets all other eligibility requirements listed below, a student can apply for up to four Emergency Educational Grants in total during their undergraduate education. The applicant cannot accept more than one ENF scholarship/grant in any one academic year.

Eligibility: The Elk parent or stepparent:

- Must have been a member in good standing for at least one year at the time of his or her death. <u>or</u>
- Must have been a member in good standing for at least one year before he or she became totally disabled and must continue to be an Elk in good standing when application for assistance is made.
- All circumstances surrounding the death or disability of the Elk parent or stepparent are subject to the review of the Elks National Foundation. The outcome of the review may affect grant approval.

The applicant must demonstrate financial need, attend an accredited U.S. college or university as a fulltime (12 semester hours) undergraduate student, and be unmarried and under the age of 24 during the academic year in which they are applying.

Applications are available upon request starting **May 1, 2024**. To request an EEG application for you or someone you know, please email scholarship@elks.org or call 773/755-4732. For more information go to: <u>https://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/Eefgrants.cfm</u>. **All applications must be received by the ENF Scholarship Office by December 1, 2024.** Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

CROCK POT

Oueso Chicken

Ingredients:

- 3-4 Chicken Breast
- 1 Jar Queso Cheese
- 1 Jar Salsa
- 1 tsp. Garlic Powder

Directions: Cook chicken on low for 6 hours. Drain all of the juices. Add Salsa, gueso and garlic powder and cook for 30 minutes.

Bacon Brown Sugar Chicken

Ingredients:

- 3-4 Chicken Breasts
- 6-8 Bacon Stips
- 1/2 C. Brown Sugar

Directions: Toss the chicken in the brown sugar. Wrap bacon around the chicken breasts. Place in the crockpot and cook on low for 6 hours.

<u>Lasagna</u>

Ingredients:

- 1 lb Italian Sausage
- 2 1/2 C. Tomato Pasta Sauce
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 9 Lasagna Noodles (not oven ready)
- 2 C. mozzarella cheese
- 1/4 C. Parmesan Cheese

Directions: In a medium skillet cook Italian Sausage until completely browned. Stir in pasta sauce and salt. Spread a little bit of sauce on the bottom of the crockpot. Place 3 lasagna noodles in the bottom. Spread sauce on noodles and top with cheese. Repeat layers 2 more times and Cook on low for 3 hours.

Pineapple Pork Loin

Ingredients:

- 2-3 lbs of pork loin
- 2 Tbsp. vegetable oil
- Salt and Pepper
- 8 cloves of minced garlic
- 1/4 C. Soy Sauce
- 1/3 C. Brown Sugar
- 1 23.5 oz can of pineapple chunks with juice

Directions: Season pork loin with salt and pepper, Heat a large pan over medium heat. Add oil and once hot, add the pork loin and brown each side for about 2-4 minutes until golden. Add pork loin to the crockpot and rub in the garlic. Add in the soy sauce and pineapple chunks with juice. Distribute brown sugar evenly over the top of the pork. Cook on low for 4-6 hours until the pork is cooked.

Pierogi Casserole with Kielbasa Ingredients:

- 1lb Kielbasa
- 4 C. Chicken Broth
- Salt and Pepper
- 1 8oz. Block of cream cheese
- 3 16 oz. boxes of cheddar pierogis Directions: Combine all ingredients into crockpot and cook on high 2-3 hours or on low 4-6 hours
