



VALENTINES DANCE



A total of 28 applications were received and judged by the Newport Elks Scholarship Committee. We were very pleased to receive applications from every high school in Campbell County this year,

In addition, the Newport Elks awards \$1,000 to the top scoring students from each school. Since 3 of the 6 students were from Bishop Brossart High School, we have decided to award an additional \$2,000 for a total of \$9,000 so that each student will receive \$1,000.

We will be awarding at total of \$7,000 (\$1,000 per school) to the highest scoring student(s) per school. All you have to do is fill out the link with the deadline and the students should be able to complete and submit the application via Google Forms. Let me know if you have any questions.

As a reminder, these awards will look at financial need as the highest weighted criteria, although academics and the student essay also factor in to the overall score. Also, students who received an award as part of the Elks Most Valuable Student Scholarship program are not eligible to apply for the College Aid Grants.
